Transcript Processing (March 2025-March 2026)

This graph represents the volume of domestic college transcripts articulated by month (1 year). This is not an apples-to-apples comparison. The Office of the Registrar transitioned to our new solution in late February. March-May 2025 could be inflated due to the backlog of transcripts during the transition. Prior to March 2025, articulation would take weeks. Today, student transcripts are articulated within 24 hours of their submission to UG Admissions. The articulation team now has more time to focus on data integrity, checking for duplicate equivalencies, reviewing general education courses, applying exemptions, and more. It is our hope that this transition is having a positive impact on advising and student support.
